

This has reference to the proposal submitted by Dhananjayrao Gadgil College of Commerce, Satara, Maharashtra-415 001 affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur for extension of autonomous status under the UGC Scheme for Autonomous Colleges.

As per the decision of the Standing Committee constituted by University Grants Commission, in its meeting held on 07.02.2022, the Competent Authority has decided to extend the autonomous status to Dhananjayrao Gadgil College of Commerce, Satara, Maharashtra-415 001 affiliated to Shivaji University, Kolhapur for a period of Ten (10) years from the session 2022-2023 to 2031-2032, as per provisions of Clause 6.5 of UGC Regulations dated 12.02.2018.

Non compliance of the requirements and conditions in the said Regulations shall attract action as per Clause -14 of the UGC Regulations - 2018. Further, it may be noted that the above said college shall also apply in the prescribed format to University Grants Commission for extension of autonomous status six months prior to the expiry of the autonomous cycle.

This Audit is made keeping in view the Mission of Rayat Shikshan Sanstha's Dhananjayrao Gadgil College of Commerce Satara. Their mission statement is to provide need based and cost effective education. To empower the students with global competencies that suit current job opportunities and ensure the holistic development of the students.

The categories provided for Audit largely help achieve the mission of the college. How effectively the current syllabi is implemented will depend on the faculty's content knowledge, ability to communicate and deliver engaging sessions, use of effective modes of teaching, ability to cater to different learner levels, institutions feedback mechanisms, opportunities for collaborations and much more.

The College runs a total of nine programs, of which few have been started in the last three years.

List of Observations, comments and suggestions on the syllabus(program-wise) BCOM - IT

The curriculum is well aligned vertically and flows well in the three year duration of the program. The initial semesters include courses that are more introductory and theoretical as well focus on language skills, personality development and soft skills. The later semesters are very heavy on skill acquisition, practicals and projects. The overall program could be said to be about 75-80% skill based and more than 50% relies on acquisition of knowledge through hands-on practicals and projects. Components on environment sensitisation is included as one course in the three year program but gender issues are not distinctly spelt out in the syllabus. The auditors are not aware if these issues are dealt with by the faculty within their purview of academic freedom given to them. If not then there is certainly a need to include these components in the syllabus.

MCOM - IT

The syllabus for this program takes off beautifully from the UG program i.e. BCOM-IT. As it should be, there is a major emphasis on skill acquisition with nearly 75% of the syllabus learning towards it. The syllabus is designed such that the majority of the courses will rely heavily on use of hands-on (Close to 60-70%) for better understanding. There are courses which take well from the personality development, organisational and corporate etiquettes introduced at the UG level. Infact the design of these components have been done exceptionally well. Looking at the teaching methods suggested in the syllabi, the auditors strongly propose to include the use of case studies, role plays, feasibility studies and other innovative teaching learning methods. Yet again the components on environment sensitisation, and gender issues are not distinctly spelt out in the syllabus.

Diploma in WEB DESIGNING

Taking into consideration that this course has multiple exit levels, it is appreciable that basic courses dealing with language and communication skills have been introduced in the first semester itself. This Diploma course mainly focuses on job competencies and is nearly 90% skill based. There is a good blend of practical components and projects going up to nearly 50% in some semesters. Environment and Gender issues do not feature in any of the semesters. There are some very nice components like IPR and Ethics in coding and programming that have been included.

BCA

Semesters 1 and 2 of this program are entirely skill and practical based, with little emphasis on personality development (nearly 20%). Sem 3 and 4 are more heavy on theory as courses on accounting, mathematics, and statistics are included. What is learnt in theory is well complemented by the one lab course in each semester. Sem 5 and 6 have some very unique skill based courses like networking, oracle...etc. This program is very intricately designed to cater to diversity of computer applications, and is indeed laudable in that respect. Overall this program is close to 70-90% skill based. Yet again there is enough scope to bring in environment related and gender issues at some level in the program, which is entirely missing as of now. The ethics related to data management is included too.

BVOC-Account and Taxation

This is a beautiful course well blended by core subjects in Accounting, Taxation, the IT elements in banking, as well as management competencies. Some amount of personal development is included in the form of consumer handling, behaviors etc. (10-20%). This newly started course is very heavily skill based (nearly 80-90%) and gives students

multiple exit options right from the certificate course to Diploma to Advanced Diploma to BVoc.

B.Voc. Financial Markets and Services

This program runs almost parallel to the BVoc-AT with many courses shared between the two. There are some courses that are unique to this program especially in the last semester. They are largely theoretical information based but relevant to the job opportunities in the area of Financial Investments. Business relationship management is one such course that focuses on interpersonal skills needed in the Business and Finance sector. It would be interesting to use Role Plays and Games for discussions in this course.

BCOM - Regular

This is a very well rounded program with a good leaning towards personality development, communication skills and also interpersonal skills needed for marketing. The syllabus has been designed well but heavy on theoretical knowledge (>50%). Subjects like Accounts, mathematics and economics could be counted as practical knowledge as they involve skill sets used in real life situations. There isn't a demarcated practical course though. This is the only program where entrepreneurial development is dealt with elaborately and this course lends its way to some innovative teaching, learning and evaluation methods. This program also has a course that discusses environmental issues. Again case studies should be included for better understanding of these courses. Economics courses do not include environment economics, Carbon credits and trading. Gender studies not spelt out in the syllabus.

MCOM- Regular

This program is a take off from the BCOM-Regular program. Some best features include courses on Leadership skills, Soft skills, stress management, quality of work life etc (10-20%). Organisational behaviour is quite extensively dealt with considering that students get placed soon after their PG programs.

Again there is a heavy theoretical component nearling to 50-65%. Practical courses are not demarcated. So it is understood that hand-on knowledge required for Accounting, mathematics and statistics is demonstrated in the classroom. Environment and Gender issues not tackled at all.

BCOM- Bank Management

This program gives the student a thorough exposure to accountancy skills, Business mathematics, statistics and economics, and an extensive training on Banking management. Though practical courses are not separately demarcated, the course

Value based questions like those that deal with Ethics, communication, empathy, problem solving, interpersonal relationships are included upto 10-20% in papers like Management practices. Language based questions and soft skill based questions do feature in papers of English for Business communication and Marketing Some papers (Banking) have plainly
